Senate Bill No. 891 - State Scholarship Fund

AN ACT concerning

Higher Education - Scholarships

FOR the purpose of requiring certain scholarship moneys to be retained by the State Scholarship Board in the general State Scholarship Fund.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 891.

This bill provides that moneys appropriated for the several State scholarship programs administered by the State Scholarship Board that are not used shall be retained by the Board in the General State Scholarship Fund instead of reverting to the State Treasury.

What apparently prompted the passage of the bill was the fact that, in each of the past several years, there
