Parole

FOR the purpose of creating the Maryland Parole Commission and providing for its composition, functions, and duties; abolishing the Maryland Board of Parole; transferring certain staff; providing for appointment of hearing examiners to assist the Commission; specifying procedures for hearing of certain cases for parole release by hearing examiners and for review by the Commission; authorizing predetermined parole release agreements; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the parole commission and to parole procedures.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 895.

This Administration bill creates the Maryland Parole Commission and restructures certain parole procedures used in this State.

House Bill 1888, which was the companion Administration bill and achieves the same purpose as this bill, was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 17, 1976.

Therefore, it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 895.
