redevelopment, including, but not limited to, comprehensive renovation or rehabilitation of any land or property, or any rights or interests therein hereinbefore mentioned, in the City of Baltimore, and the disposition of land and property for such purposes; the elimination of unhealthful, unsanitary or unsafe conditions, lessening density, eliminating obsolete or other uses detrimental to the public welfare or otherwise removing or preventing the spread of blight or deterioration in the City of Baltimore; the demolition, removal, relocation, renovation or alteration of land, buildings, streets, highways, alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or improvements, and for construction, reconstruction, installation, relocation or repair of buildings, streets. highways, alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or improvements; the payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred for or in connection with doing any or all of the things herein mentioned, including, but not limited to, the costs and expenses of securing administrative appraisal, economic analysis, engineering, planning, designing, architectural, surveying, and other professional services; and doing any all things necessary, proper or expedient in connection with or pertaining to any all of the matters or things hereinbefore mentioned: authorizing said municipality to submit an ordinance or ordinances for said purpose to the legal voters of Baltimore City, and providing the issuance and sale of said generally for certificates of indebtedness.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1578.

This bill authorizes Baltimore City to issue bonds in an amount not exceeding ten million dellars to implement the Community Development Program.

Senate Bill 649, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 13, 1976, accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore, it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 1578.
