(a) A person may catch oysters or clams in the waters of the State only by HAND, rakes, tongs, patent tongs, DIVING APPARATUS, dredges, handscrapes, cultch material suspended on strings, in trays, in bags, or similar devices. Soft-shell clams may be caught by hydraulic or mechanical dredges or rigs.

(c) During the open season for migratory WILD waterfowl, a person may not catch oysters in Charles County within 500 yards of any stationary blind or blind site which is occupied and is being used for hunting migratory WILD waterfowl.
