The Board of County Commissioners shall during the month of [May] APRIL of each year give notice to the people of Caroline County, by advertisement in at least two newspapers of general circulation and published in [said] THE county, of the times and place of the sitting of [said] Board of Estimates during the following [June] MAY, and that at such sittings the [said] Board of Estimates will receive and consider applications for appropriations for improvements and other purposes and such other matters as may be brought before them in connection with which money may be appropriated.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1976.

CHAPTER 209

(House Bill 1423)

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City - Street Lighting Bond Issue

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to create a debt, and to issue and sell its certificates of indebtedness as evidence thereof, to an amount not exceeding One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), the proceeds derived from the sale of the certificates of indebtedness to be used for the purpose of extending, improving and modernizing the lighting system used for illumination of the highways, streets, alleys ways in the City of Baltimore, public including, but not limited to, the conversion of ornamental incandescent residential street lighting units and facilities to other units and facilities, and the acquisition, installation and erection of any and all materials, equipment, lighting units, facilities needed to properly structures and illuminate the aforementioned public ways, and for doing any and all things necessary, proper or expedient in connection with or pertaining to any or all of the matters or things herein mentioned; authorizing said municipality to submit an ordinance or ordinances for said purpose to the legal voters of Baltimore City, and providing generally for the issuance and sale of said certificates of indebtedness.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
