(a) If a party or witness is deaf [[or a deaf-mute]] or cannot readily understand or communicate the SPOKEN English language, any party may apply to the court for the appointment of a qualified interpreter to assist that person. UPON THE APPLICATION OF ANY PARTY OR WITNESS WHO IS DEAF [[OR A DEAF-MUTE]] THE COURT SHALL APPOINT A QUALIFIED INTERPRETER TO ASSIST THAT PERSON. THE COURT SHALL MAINTAIN A DIRECTORY OF INTERPRETERS FOR MANUAL COMMUNICATION AND/OR ORAL INTERPRETATION TO ASSIST DEAF PERSONS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1976.
