

THE DRIVER OF ANY OTHER VEHICLE THAT IS WITHIN 500 FEET AND APPROACHING FROM EITHER DIRECTION.

21-603. STARTING VEHICLE.

A PERSON MAY NOT START A VEHICLE THAT IS STOPPED, STANDING, OR PARKED UNTIL:

(1) THE MOVEMENT CAN BE MADE WITH REASONABLE SAFETY; AND

(2) IF ANY OTHER VEHICLE MIGHT BE AFFECTED BY THE MOVEMENT, HE GIVES AN ADEQUATE SIGNAL TO ONCOMING APPROACHING TRAFFIC.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section presently appears as Art. 66 1/2, §11-603.

In item (2) of this section, the introductory phrase "if any other vehicle might be affected . . .," is added for clarity and to conform to the similar provision in §21-604(a) (3) of this subtitle.

The only other changes are in style.

21-604. TURNING, SLOWING, AND STOPPING MOVEMENTS; REQUIRED SIGNALS.

(A) MANNER OF MAKING TURN.

A PERSON MAY NOT:

(1) TURN A VEHICLE AT AN INTERSECTION, UNLESS THE VEHICLE IS IN THE POSITION REQUIRED BY §21-601 OF THIS SUBTITLE;

(2) TURN A VEHICLE TO ENTER A PRIVATE ROAD OR DRIVEWAY OR OTHERWISE TURN A VEHICLE FROM A DIRECT COURSE OR MOVE IT RIGHT OR LEFT ON A ROADWAY, UNLESS THE MOVEMENT CAN BE MADE WITH REASONABLE SAFETY; OR

(3) IF ANY OTHER VEHICLE MIGHT BE AFFECTED BY THE MOVEMENT, TURN A VEHICLE UNTIL HE GIVES AN APPROPRIATE SIGNAL IN THE MANNER REQUIRED BY THIS SUBTITLE.

(B) WHERE SIGNALS TO BE GIVEN.

WHEN REQUIRED, A SIGNAL OF INTENTION TO TURN RIGHT OR LEFT SHALL BE GIVEN CONTINUOUSLY DURING AT LEAST THE LAST 100 FEET TRAVELED BY THE VEHICLE BEFORE TURNING.
