(I) AIRPORT HAZARD.

"AIRPORT HAZARD" MEANS ANY STRUCTURE, TREE OR OTHER VEGETATION, OR USE OF LAND THAT:

- (1) OBSTRUCTS THE AIRSPACE REQUIRED FOR THE LANDING OR TAKING OFF OF AIRCRAFT AT AN AIRPORT:
- (2) IS HAZARDOUS TO THE LANDING OR TAKING OFF OF AIRCRAFT AT AN AIRPORT; OR
- (3) INTERFERES WITH COMMUNICATION BETWEEN AN AIRPORT AND AIRCRAFT.
