The bidding requirements of this section apply to contracts of \$5,000 or more; in §§ 5-214 and 7-403 of this article, dealing with the State Aviation Administration and the Mass Transit Administration, respectively, the like requirement applies only to construction contracts costing over \$10,000. Also, while the various other provisions of §§ 5-214 and 7-403 are substantively similar to one another, the provisions of this section are of a considerably dissimilar nature. The General Assembly may wish to review those various sections and consider conforming their respective provisions.
