persons the Governor shall make further appointments to the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners. In case of failure of said Osteopathic]. If THE Association FAILS to submit [said] THE list [, as aforesaid], the Governor, upon the recommendation of the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, shall appoint members in good standing of [said Osteopathic] THE Association[, without restriction; provided, however, that said members shall be qualified as aforesaid, by graduation and practice] WHO ARE OTHER WISE OUALIFIED TO SERVE.

[From and after April 13, 1914, any] ANY [not heretofore authorized] WHO DESIRES practice osteopathy in this State [and desiring to enter upon such practice, may deliver] SHALL SUBMIT to the secretary of the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners [, the payment of] a \$45 \$25 APPLICATION fee [of dollars], twenty-five a written application examination, [together with] AND satisfactory proof that the applicant is more than eighteen years of age, is of moral character, [has obtained a preliminary Doop education, as hereinafter provided,] and has received a diploma conferring the degree of Dcctor of Osteopathy from [some legally incorporated, reputable csteopathic] A college for the United States, or some foreign country, wherein course of instruction consists of] OR UNIVERSITY ACCREDITED BY THE AMERICAN OSTEOPATHY ASSOCIATION AND REQUIRING at least three [separate] years of [not less than nine months in each separate year] PREFROFESSIONAL AND FOUR YEARS OF GRADUATE PROFESSIONAL STUDY. [applicants who receive their degree in csteopathy after first day of January, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, must have pursued the study of osteopathy for four years, of at least eight months in each year, in four different calendar years, the work of each year having been successfully passed in some legally incorporated reputable csteopathic school, or college, prior to the granting of said diploma or foreign license; provided, however, that any applicant who shall have completed a course of study in any osteopathic college, consisting of three years of nine months each, and a postgraduate course of at least five months, aggregating at least thirty-two months, shall be accepted in lieu of full period of four years of eight months each, provided for in this subtitle. Provided, further, that anyone who is in the practice of osteopathy in scme other state on April 13, 1914, and who is a graduate from a reputable and legally incorporated college cf osteopathy, providing a course of study at least four terms of five menths each shall be eliqible for examination, upon all other terms and conditions provided for applicants for examination under the provisions of this subtitle. provided, further, that the completion of the regular four years' course and graduation from a reputable literary college in which four years course, two years were devoted to scientific and biclogical work in said
