(a) Any person over the age of [21 years] 18, the guardian of any person [over the age of 21 years] on behalf of [such] THAT person, or anyone else having a legitimate interest in the welfare of a person [over the age of 21 years], may apply to the Administration for admission of that person to the appropriate public facility within the jurisdiction of the Administration. The individual making the application must, as a prerequisite to the admission, be able to understand the nature of the request. The application shall be in writing and shall be in such form as may be required by the Administration.

11.

(a) Any person over the age of [21 years] 18, the guardian of any person [over the age of 21 years] on behalf of [such] THAT person, or anyone else having a legitimate interest in the welfare of a person [over the age of 21 years], may apply to any private facility licensed by the Administration for the admission of such person. The individual making the application must, as a prerequisite to the admission, be able to understand the nature of the request. The application to such private facility shall be in writing and in such form as may be required by the Administration.
