the Annotated Code of Maryland (1976 Replacement Volume and 1976 Supplement) be and they are hereby repealed:

Article 2C - Alcoholism

[Disorderly Intoxication]

[201.

- (a) No person shall be intoxicated and endanger the safety of another person or property.
- (b) No person shall be intoxicated or drink any alcoholic beverage in a public place and cause a public disturbance.
- (c) Any person violating the prchibitions of this section is guilty of a misdemeaner and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment of not more than 90 days, or both.
- (d) No county, municipality or other political subdivision of this State shall adopt ordinances or resolutions identical to or supplementing this section, and any existing ordinance, resolution, or other legislation inconsistent with this section is hereby repealed.
- (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, Baltimore County is authorized to adopt ordinances or resolutions supplementing this section, including but not limited to the authority to regulate possession or consumption of any alcoholic beverage on any public property or property used by the public in general or on any highway.]

[201A.

In Montgomery County, no person may drink any alcoholic reverage, as defined in Article 2E, Section 2(a), Annotated Code of Maryland, (A) on public property without authorization ky a governmental entity which has jurisdiction over such property, (B) on the mall, or on adjacent parking areas, or other cutside areas, of any combination of privately owned retail establishments, commonly known as a shopping center, to which the general is invited for business purposes without public authorization by the owner of such shorping center, adjacent parking areas or other outside areas of any other retail establishment without the authorization the owner of such establishment or (D) in any parked vehicle located on any of the foregoing places enumerated in this subsection without such authorization. case of public property, any governmental entity cwning or otherwise having jurisdiction over the property is empowered to adopt by local law, ordinance, rule or regulation, as appropriate, standards providing for the authorization of the consumption of alcoholic beverages
