(Senate Joint Resolution 35)

A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

Reclamation Programs and Training

FOR the purpose of endorsing efforts underway on the part of Frostburg State College, Maryland Energy and Coastal Zone Administration of the Department of Natural Resources and Appalachian Environmental Laboratory of the University of Maryland Center for Environmental and Estuarine Studies to establish a cooperative academic program in reclamation and to undertake joint research activities; and, assuming formal adoption of such an academic relationship by the appropriate educational authorities, arranging the relocation of the Maryland Bureau of Mines, currently located in Westernport, Maryland, to a suitable facility on the Frostburg State College Campus in order to facilitate and enhance such a joint educational venture involving State regulatory and educational institutions.

WHEREAS, Officials of Frostburg State College, the Maryland Energy and Coastal Zone Administration of the Department of Natural Resources, and the Appalachian Environmental Laboratory of the University of Maryland Center for Environmental and Estuarine Studies have during the past year engaged in a series of discussions for the purpose of exploring the feasibility of
