appropriate interim committee for further study and analysis of the proposed system, consultation with local governments and appropriate State agencies, and a report to the General Assembly on the merits of the proposed system and whether any additional State enabling legislation is appropriate or necessary; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution he sent to the Maryland Municipal League, the Maryland Association of Counties, the Departments of Economic and Community Development, Wealth and Mental Hygiene, Natural Resources, Planning, and Transportation, the Home Builders Association of Maryland, the School of Architecture of the University of Maryland, and the Center for Metropolitan Planning and Research of the Johns Hopkins University.
