FOR the purpose of requesting the Department of Transportation, in consultation with the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services and the Department of Education, and pursuant to the advice and counsel of representatives of certain State, county and municipal subdivisions and agencies, highway user groups and associations, bicycling groups and associations, and such other individuals and organizations as may be determined to be able to contribute pertinent knowledgeable input, to organize a special Citizens Bicycle Study Committee to review certain concerns relating to bicycles and their use and make appropriate recommendations for the resolution of those concerns, with the goal of
