In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 54.

This bill specifies a penalty for persons convicted of the common law crime of indecent exposure.

House Bill 92, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by Lieutenant Governor Blair Lee III in his capacity as Acting Governor on May 17, 1977, accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 54.
