This bill provides new alternatives for dealing with aggressive and violent offenders.

House Bill 907, which was the companion Administration bill and achieves the same purpose as this bill, was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by Lieutenant Governor Blair Lee III in his capacity as Acting Governor on May 26, 1977.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 452.
