AN ACT concerning

Retail Sales Tax - Exemptions

~~FOR the purpose of exempting from retail sales taxation sales to persons operating certain organizations exempt from federal taxation under certain provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.~~

FOR the purpose of requiring certain institutions and organizations to apply to the Comptroller to qualify for an exemption from the retail sales tax; and providing for this qualification under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 531.

This bill generally relates to the exemption from the State retail sales tax of certain nonprofit
