A Resolution of the City Council of Laurel pursuant to the provisions of Article 23A, §§11 through 18, titled "Corporations-Municipal", subtitled "Charter Amendments", of the Annotated Code of Maryland to amend the City Charter of Laurel, subtitled "Police", entitled "§41. Appointments: duties.", the purpose of which is to provide for the appointment of the Chief of Police in like manner as that of the City Supervisor and the Clerk-Treasurer and to eliminate such portions thereof now obsolete.
