WHEREAS, thereafter a public notice of said Resolution was published not fewer than four times at not less than weekly intervals in the Montgomery County Sentinel, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Rockville and the area to be annexed, the said notice specifying that a public hearing would be held on said Resolution in the Council Chamber, Rockville City Hall, by the Mayor and Council at 8:30 P.M. on July 12, 1976; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council conducted a public hearing on said Resolution at the time and place provided for in said advertisement; and said matter having been fully considered and deliberated by the Mayor and Council, and said Council having decided that said Resolution should be adopted;
