

(3) AMBULANCES; AND

(4) SPECIAL VEHICLES FUNDED OR PROVIDED BY FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND USED FOR EMERGENCY OR RESCUE PURPOSES IN THIS STATE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section presently appears as Art. 66 1/2, §1-103.

The shorter, but no less meaningful, "emergency vehicle" is substituted for the present "authorized emergency vehicle" as the defined term.

The only other changes are in style.

11-119. EXPLOSIVE.

"EXPLOSIVE" MEANS ANY CHEMICAL COMPOUND OR MECHANICAL MIXTURE THAT IS COMMONLY USED OR INTENDED TO PRODUCE AN EXPLOSION AND THAT CONTAINS ANY OXIDIZING AND COMBUSTIVE UNITS OR OTHER INGREDIENTS IN SUCH PROPORTIONS, QUANTITIES, OR PACKING THAT AN IGNITION BY FIRE, FRICTION, CONCUSSION, PERCUSSION, OR DETONATOR OF ANY PART OF THE COMPOUND OR MIXTURE MAY CAUSE A SUDDEN GENERATION OF HIGHLY HEATED GASES AND RESULTANT GASEOUS PRESSURES CAPABLE OF INJURING PEOPLE OR PROPERTY.

11-120. FARM EQUIPMENT.

"FARM EQUIPMENT" MEANS A VEHICLE THAT:

(1) IS DESIGNED AND ADAPTED ONLY FOR AGRICULTURAL, HORTICULTURAL, OR LIVESTOCK RAISING OPERATIONS; OR

(2) IS DESIGNED AND ADAPTED ONLY FOR LIFTING OR CARRYING A VEHICLE DESCRIBED IN ITEM (1) OF THIS SECTION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section presently appears as Art. 66 1/2, §1-136.

The more meaningful "farm equipment" is substituted for the esoteric and somewhat archaic "implement of husbandry" as the defined term.

The last clause of present Art. 66 1/2, §1-136, which exempts farm equipment from the registration requirements of the Maryland Vehicle Law, is deleted as unnecessary in light of §13-402(c) (3) of this article to the same effect.
