WHENEVER A PHYSICIAN, CHIROPRACTOR, DENTIST, PODIATRIST, OPTOMETRIST, PHARMACIST, NURSE, OPTICIAN, OR OTHER HEALTH PRACTITIONER LICENSED OR CERTIFIED IN THIS STATE IS CONVICTED OF FRAUD IN CONNECTION WITH THE MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, THE PHYSICIAN OR OTHER PRACTITIONER MAY NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR ANY FURTHER PAYMENTS UNDER THE MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. HOWEVER, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE MAY REINSTATE A PHYSICIAN OR OTHER PRACTITIONER IF THE SECRETARY DETERMINES THAT SUCH DENIAL OF PARTICIPATION COULD RESULT IN DEPRIVING HEDICAL ASSISTANCE RECIPIENTS OF NEEDED HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN A MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED AREA.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1978.
