OF THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE MINOR IS CONFINED, OR IN THE SUPREME BENCH OF BALTIMORE CITY, IF THE MINOR IS CONFINED IN A FACILITY IN BALTIMORE CITY.

- (2) UPON FINDING A PAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SUBSECTION (A) THE COURT SHALL ORDER THE FACILITY TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THAT SECTION. IF THE COURT FINDS THAT THE FACILITY IS UNABLE TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, IT SHALL ORDER THE IMMEDIATE UNCONDITIONAL RELEASE OF THE MINOR OR IMMEDIATE TRANSFER OF THE MINOR. THE COURT MAY ORDER A MINOR TO BE TRANSFERD TO BITHER A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE FACILITY CAPABLE OF MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION AND PROVIDING THE TREATMENT AND CARE WHICH WILL ACCOMPLISH THE DURPOSE FOR WHICH THE MINOR WAS ORIGINALLY ADMITTED, COMMITTED, OR CONTINED.
- (3) ALL COSTS OF PLACING AND MAINTAINING A MINOR—IN—A-PRIVATE FACILITY SHALL BE PAID BY THE STATE TO THE EXTENT THESE COSTS EXCEED THE AMOUNT THAT WOULD OTHERWISE—BE—PAID—BY—PERSONS LEGALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COST—OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES—THAT—WOULD BE PROVIDED—IN——A PUBLIC—FACILITY.
- + C+ THE GOVERNOR-SHALL ANNUALLY INCLUDE IN THE STATE
 BUDGET -- AN -- AMOUNT -- NECISCARY -- TO ENABLE THE STATE TO COMPLY
 WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

(House Bill 427)
