- (G) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION.
- (H) EACH BOARD MAY ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ITS MEETINGS.
- (I) EACH BOARD SERVES IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY AND SHALL HAVE THE DUTY TO:
- (1) ADVISE THE SUPERINTENDENT OR DIRECTOR OF THE FACILITY IN DETERMINING THE GOALS OF THE STATE PACILITY AND ASSIST IN EVALUATING THE ACHIEVEMENT OF THESE GOALS:
- (2) ADVISE THE SUPERINTENDENT WITH RESPECT TO THE PACILITY, ITS PROGRAMS AND POLICIES;
- (3) REVIEW AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE ANNUAL BUDGET;
- (4) ASSUME LEADERSHIP IN DEVELOPING COMMUNITY UNDERSTANDING OF THE NEEDS OF THE MENTALLY RETARDED;
- (5) CARRY OUT ANY OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES REQUESTED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OR DIRECTOR OF THE STATE FACILITY: AND
- (6) SUBMIT TO THE SECRETARY AN ANNUAL REPORT THAT IDENTIFIES THE NEEDS OF THE MENTALLY RETARDED AND THE EXTENT THAT THE STATE PACILITY IS MEETING THESE NEEDS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That of the seven board members initially appointed for each facility, their terms shall begin on July 1, 1978 and shall be staggered as the Governor designates so that three members serve for one year terms, two members serve for two year terms; and two members serve for three year terms two members serve for one-year terms, two members serve for three-year terms, and one member serves a four-year term.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1978.
