(e) If the State's attorney within 45 days after receipt of the State Prosecutor's findings and recommendations fails to file charges and commence prosecution in accordance with the recommendations, the State Prosecutor may prosecute those criminal offenses as set forth in his investigative report and recommendations. HOWEVER, THE STATE PROSECUTOR MAY IMMEDIATELY PROSECUTE CRIMINAL OFFENSES SET FORTH IN HIS INVESTIGATIVE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS IF ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN COMMITTED BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY HAVING JURISDICTION OVER THE MATTER.

AN ACT concerning

Pensions - Boards of Trustees
