THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL DEVELOP A PROGRAM TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE IN EACH OF THE LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES. IN IMPLEMENTING THIS PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL:

(1) ADOPT REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTING THE PROGRAM IN EACH OF THE LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES;

(2) CONTINUOUSLY MONITOR AND EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THIS PROGRAM;

(3) TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, COORDINATE FOR THE SINGLE PARENT DELIVERY OF EDUCATION, HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH, EMPLOYMENT, AND CHILD DAY CARE SERVICES PROVIDED BY PUBLIC AND PRIVATE AGENCIES;

(4) PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE TRAINING OF PERSONS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE SERVICES; AND

(5) UTILIZE, TO THE EXTENT AVAILABLE, GRANTS FROM FEDERAL, STATE, AND OTHER PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SOURCES TO FUND THE SINGLE PARENT SERVICES PROGRAM.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1978.

AN ACT concerning

Prince George's County - Minority Business

FOR the purpose of providing that, with a certain exception, a reasonable percentage of contracts for consultant and construction services and for purchases entered into by Prince George's County shall be awarded to minority business firms; defining the term "minority business firm"; and providing that certain assistance shall be provided minority business firms seeking county contracts.
