

Maryland has been granted \$213,215 to continue its outreach program for an off-campus baccalaureate program for registered nurses in eastern and western Maryland; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Commission for Nursing, as a vehicle for providing nursing input into policy decisions regarding health care, recommended in its 1977 Study of Nursing and Nursing Education in Maryland that the availability of baccalaureate nursing education in Maryland for registered nurses should be increased; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That, in order to augment the pool of baccalaureate level nurses more rapidly, each postsecondary institution in Maryland offering a generic baccalaureate nursing program in Maryland be charged with the responsibility for the recruitment and admission of registered nurses who are motivated to pursue such study; and be it further further education at the Baccalaureate level; and be it further

A House Joint Resolution concerning

Clean Community Program of Annapolis
