(Senate Joint Resolution 17)

A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

CFTA Funds - Use at State and Local Level

FOR the purpose of requesting the preparation of a comprehensive study on the use of CETA (Comprehensive Employment Training Act) funds at the State and local levels.

WHEREAS, \$109 million was distributed to Baltimore City and surrounding counties local jurisdictions through the CETA program in 1977; and

WHEREAS, The prime aim of these funds is to provide job training and jobs for chronically unemployed persons and the unskilled poor; and

WHEREAS, These funds are administered through the Mayor's-Office-of-Manpower local jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, The majority of jobs created are in the public sector; and

WHEREIS, Approximately—ten—of—3500—jobs——in——the Baltimore——metropolitar——area—went—te—politically—well connected—reople;—and

WHEREAS, There is no regulation which bars CETA workers from staying on the public payroll after CETA funding ends; and

WHEREAS, There has never been a comprehensive statewide study of the use of CFTA funds; now, therefore, be it

RESCLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Acting Governor is requested to establish a study group for the purpose of determining how CETA funds are used at the State and local level; and be it further
