House Bill 1793, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 16, 1978, excludes farm silos in all counties from valuation for purposes of State and county taxation.

Since the purpose of House Bill 290 is accomplished by the enactment and signing of House Bill 1793, it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 290.

Juvenile Causes - Definitions

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 314.

This bill redefines a "child in need of supervision" in the provisions of the Juvenile Causes law.

Senate Bill 551, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 29, 1978, clarifies and otherwise amends numerous provisions of the Juvenile Causes law. In doing so, Senate Bill 551 also redefines a "child in need of supervision" in a manner consistent with the intention of House Bill 314.
