

This bill repeals certain obsolete provisions that relate to the membership of employees of certain governmental units in the Employees' Retirement System.

Senate Bill 671, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 16, 1978, accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 1022.

AN ACT concerning

Public Service Commission - Electric Metering and
Ignition Devices

FOR the purpose of providing for the installation and regulation of electric metering and submetering in apartment houses and, condominiums, and cooperatives by the Public Service Commission; and requiring the Commission to develop specifications for certification of ignition devices for gas appliances by a certain date; and providing for the handling of certain complaints arising out of this Act.
