

CHARTER AMENDMENT NO. 88-77-4

RESOLUTION of The Commissioners of Cambridge adopted pursuant to the authority of Article 11E of the Constitution of Maryland and Section 13 of Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended), title "Corporation - Municipal", to amend the Charter of The Commissioners of Cambridge by repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Section 3-2 entitled "Corporate Limits" of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland entitled "Dorchester County", subtitled "Cambridge" to show the change in boundaries affected by the recent annexation of certain lands.

RESOLUTION of The Commissioners of Cambridge adopted pursuant to the authority of Article 11E of the Constitution of Maryland and Section 13 of Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended), entitled "Corporation - Municipal", to amend the Charter of The Commissioners of Cambridge by repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Subsection (e) entitled "Fourth Ward" of Section 3-3 entitled "Boundaries of Wards" of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland entitled "Dorchester County", subtitled "Cambridge" to reflect the change in the boundaries of the Fourth Ward created by recent annexation.

CHARTER AMENDMENT NO. 90-77-6

RESOLUTION of The Commissioners of Cambridge, Maryland adopted pursuant to the authority of Article 11E of the Constitution of Maryland and Section 13 of Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended), entitled "Corporation - Municipal" to amend the Charter of The Commissioners of Cambridge by adding a new subsection (d) to Section 3-42 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Dorchester County (1974 Edition), providing that the City may borrow money for any lawful public purpose, including refunding of outstanding obligations.
