

(E) ADMINISTRATION OF CENTER.

(1) THE HEAD OF EACH REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTER IS THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE LIBRARY DESIGNATED AS THE CENTER.

(2) THE ADMINISTRATOR SHALL OPERATE THE REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTER UNDER STANDARDS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

(3) THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES OF THE REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTER SHALL BE:

(I) RECOMMENDED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LIBRARY DESIGNATED AS THE CENTER; AND

(II) APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF ADVISORS OF THE CENTER.

(F) DUTIES OF REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTERS.

EACH REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTER SHALL:

(1) MAKE INTERLIBRARY LOANS OF BOOKS AND MATERIALS;

(2) SUPPLY COLLECTIONS AND EXHIBITS OF SPECIALIZED MATERIALS;

(3) PROVIDE CONSULTANT SERVICES;

(4) ORGANIZE INSERVICE TRAINING FOR LIBRARY STAFFS; AND

(5) DEVELOP AND OPERATE COOPERATIVE SERVICES AMONG LIBRARIES.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section presently appears as Art. 77, §169(a) (1) through (6).

The second sentence of present Art. 77, §169(a) (1) which authorizes counties included in a standard metropolitan statistical area as a result of the 1970 census to remain in a regional resource center is deleted as unnecessary since the requirement that the county be outside a standard metropolitan statistical area applies only to the formation of a center and not to its continuation.

The only other changes are in style.

23-203. METROPOLITAN COOPERATIVE SERVICES PROGRAMS.

(A) AUTHORIZED.

THE BOARD OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES OF ANY PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM THAT IS NOT PARTICIPATING IN A REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTER MAY PARTICIPATE IN A METROPOLITAN COOPERATIVE SERVICE PROGRAM.
