

(3) RESPOND TO REQUESTS FROM THE SECRETARY FOR ADVICE ON SPECIFIC PROBLEMS;

(4) ASSIST APPROPRIATE STATE AGENCIES AND PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS OR ORGANIZATIONS CONCERNING THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROPOSALS FOR GRANTS RELATING TO TOXIC AND CARCINOGENIC SUBSTANCES;

(5) EVALUATE THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF VARIOUS PROPOSALS RELATING TO TOXIC AND CARCINOGENIC SUBSTANCES; AND

(6) DEVELOP AN EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION SYSTEM FOR DEALING WITH EMERGENCIES INVOLVING TOXIC AND CARCINOGENIC SUBSTANCES.

(B) THE SECRETARY SHALL REFER TO THE COUNCIL ALL SIGNIFICANT ISSUES INVOLVING TOXIC AND CARCINOGENIC SUBSTANCES.

(C) THE COUNCIL SHALL PREPARE AND SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE THE SECOND WEDNESDAY OF JANUARY OF EACH YEAR. THIS REPORT SHALL DESCRIBE THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COUNCIL DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR AND INCLUDE ANY RECOMMENDATIONS THAT WOULD ALLOW THE COUNCIL TO BETTER FULFILL ITS PURPOSES.

(D) THE SECRETARY MAY ASK PERSONS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL BUT WHO HAVE EXPERTISE IN A PARTICULAR AREA TO CONSULT WITH THE COUNCIL OR ONE OF ITS SUBCOMMITTEES.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1979.

CHAPTER 371

(House Bill 1108)

AN ACT concerning

Alcoholic Beverages - License Holder

FOR the purpose of including a corporation within the organization defined as "license holder" or "licensee" in Article 2B for delivery and billing purposes.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
