SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTFD BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed, amended, or enacted to read as follows:

Article 43 - Health

394.

(E) (1) A PERMIT TO OPERATE A LANDFILL REFUSE DISPOSAL SYSTEM OR SLUDGE COMPOSTING FACILITY SHALL BE VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS FROM THE DATE OF ISSUE OR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION UNLESS SUSPENDED OR REVOKED BY THE DEPARTMENT. THE PERMIT SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY RENEWED UPON WRITTEN APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT. IF THE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT GRANT WRITTEN RENEWAL APPROVAL PRIOR TO THE PERMIT'S EXPIRATION BECAUSE OF FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT, THE PERMITTEE SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT WITHIN THE PRESCRIBED TIME PERIOD, OR FILE A NEW APPLICATION.

(2) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT APPLY IN ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY.

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(b) An-individual-or-corporation-for-commercial purposes—and—a municipality,—county,—district,—or institution—may not-engage in-collection,—handling,—burning,
