ADDITIONAL PER DIEM ALLOWANCE PROVIDED BY SOURCES OTHER THAN THE STATE, NOT TO EXCEED THE ALLOWANCE SET BY THE COMMITTEE.

AN ACT concerning

Industrial Development Financing - Revenue Bonds and MIDFA
