Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects and engineers fees: for the repair and restoration of the historic hand-crafted stone and concrete LeGore Bridge on the Monocacy River in Frederick County.

- (4) The Board of Public Works may not expend any funds on this project unless the Frederick County Commissioners have provided funds in equal amounts. The Board of Public Works shall match the Frederick County funds dollar for dollar up to \$250,000.
- (5) If any funds provided by this Act are not encumbered within three years from the effective date of this Act, then the funds shall be deemed to be abandoned. If the total loan authorized by this Act has been issued within three years from the effective date of this Act, then the amount specified in this Act for the abandoned funds shall be transferred to the Annuity Bond Fund and shall be applied to the deht service requirements of the State. If, however, the total loan authorized by this Act has not been issued within three years from the effective date of this Act, then the total issuable bonds authorized by this Act shall be reduced by the amount specified in this Act for abandoned funds. For the purposes of this Act, funds are encumbered when a project is approved for a grant under this program for a specific amount by actions of the Board of Public Works.
- (6) There is hereby levied and imposed an annual State tax on all assessable property in the State in rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds as and when due and until paid in full, such principal to be discharged within fifteen years of the date of issue of the bonds.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1979.

(House Bill 1749)

AN ACT concerning

Orphans' Court - Prince George's County
PG 332-79

FOR the purpose of allowing a judge of the Orphans' Court, who is also an attorney, to conduct the business of the court in the absence of the other judges; and providing that, if necessary, court may be held 5 days a week.
