SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed, amended, or enacted to read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

(4) (I) A special Class C (golf and country club) license shall be issued, upon approval by the board of license commissioners of Prince George's County, to any golf country club in said county applying therefor which has [two hundred (200)] \$200 or more bona fide members paying dues of not less than [seventy-five (\$75.00)] \$75 per annum per member, which maintains at the time of application for the license two or more tennis courts, a swimming pool at least 30 by 80 feet in size, and a regular or championship golf course of 9 holes or more, or has [five hundred (500)] \$500 or more bona fide dues-paying members and maintains at the time of the application for the license a regular or championship golf course of 18 holes or more. [licensee] LICENSE shall authorize the holder thereof to keep for sale and to sell at retail any alcoholic beverages, to any customer at the place described in said license, for consumption on or off its premises. The annual fee for said golf and country club licenses [shall be eight hundred dollars (\$800.00)] IS \$800, which shall be paid to clerk before any such license is issued. The application for any of said licenses filed on behalf of any such golf and country club in Prince George's County shall be signed by at least one officer of said club, who shall be a resident, registered voter and taxpayer of Prince George's County. Such golf and country club license shall be subject to all the provisions of this article, except that any restrictions against the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sundays, appearing elsewhere in this article, shall not apply to any licensee holding said special Class C (golf and country club) license; provided, however, sales on Sunday under such license shall be made only to the bona fide members of such golf and country club and to guests of such
