## Adoption Laws Study

FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor to create a commission to study and recommend revisions of the adoption laws.

WHEREAS, This is a subject which generates considerable emotion both for and against opening records; and

WHEREAS, An objective and dispassionate evaluation of all adoption laws and procedures including those involving the sealing of records is necessary in order to insure the privacy and rights of all persons involved in an adoption; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Governor is requested to establish a commission to study the adoption laws; and be it further
