House Bill 38, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on March 26, 1979, accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 25.

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City — Recreation and Parks
Bond Issue

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to create a debt, and to issue and sell its certificates of indebtedness as evidence thereof, to an amount not exceeding One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00), the proceeds derived from the sale of the certificates of indebtedness to be used for the acquisition, by purchase or condemnation or any legal means, of land or property in the City of Baltimore and establishing thereon or therein, or on or in land or property now or hereafter owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, new parks, playgrounds, playfields, playlots, recreational centers recreational buildings; and for the design, redesign, development, redevelopment and improvement of park, school and other properties now or hereafter owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore for park or for the acquisition, recreational purposes; and construction, reconstruction, installation, erection, protection, extension, enlargement, renovation modernization of, and additions to, public park or recreational buildings, structures or facilities; and for the acquisition and installation of equipment for and all new facilities an y authorized established constructed, erected OT under provisions hereof, and for doing any and all things necessary, proper or expedient in connection with or pertaining to any or all of the matters or things hereinbefore mentioned; provided, however, that no part of such proceeds shall be used to pay costs not directly related to and required for the acquisition,
