House Bill No. 218

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Disabled Person's Parking Permit

FOR the purpose of providing for the issuance of a Disabled Person's Parking Permit by the Motor Vehicle Administration; establishing eligibility requirements for the applicant; setting an issuance and renewal fee; setting an expiration date; specifying the permits permit's form and content; providing for the permit's use and the privileges to be derived therefrom; prohibiting its use by other than the person to whom issued; prohibiting a person from committing fraud in applying for or using the permit, and generally relating to the issuance and use of a Disabled Person's Parking Permit.
