Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

(b) It is the intention of the legislature by this section to provide for uniform prohibition throughout the State of Maryland of any and all littering on public or private property, and to curb thereby the desecration of the beauty of the State and harm to the health, welfare and safety of its citizens caused by individuals who litter. HOWEVER, TO PERMIT MORE ACTIVE ENFORCEMENT OF LITTERING PROHIBITIONS WITHIN A MUNICIPALITY, THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF A MUNICIPALITY MAY PROHIBIT LITTERING, AS DOES THIS SECTION, AND CLASSIFY LITTERING AS A MUNICIPAL INFRACTION UNDER ARTICLE 23A, SECTION 3(B) OF THE CODE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1979.
