


my Will is that it be equally divided between my Daughters viz<sup>t</sup>

whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this first  
day of May one thousand seven hundred & eighty three. —

April 10<sup>th</sup> 1785 Then came William Gleaves Charles Tilden Jun<sup>r</sup> and  
James Ansley the three Subscribing Witnesses to the within last Will  
and Testament of Gustavus Hanson late of Kent County deceased, and  
severally made oath on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God, that  
they did see the Testator within named sign and seal this Will  
and that they heard him publish pronounce and declare the same  
to be his last Will and Testament; that at the same time he was to  
the best of their apprehensions of sound disposing mind memory  
and Understanding; and that they severally subscribed their respective  
names as Witnesses to this Will, in the presence, and at the Request  
of the Testator, and in the presence of each other. —
