 do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner &  
 form following, that is to say I bequeath my Soul into the hands of

 hereafter mentioned shall think fit. I Inprim<sup>o</sup>. I give & bequeath  
 my whole Estate Real & personal to William Foreman, <sup>son of John Foreman</sup> Wheel Wright  
 after the payment of my just debts, to him the said William &  
 his heirs for ever, And lastly I do hereby appoint & ordain  
 Cap<sup>t</sup>. Josiah Johnston and Cap<sup>t</sup>. Phillip Read my whole & sole  
 Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof  
 I have hereunto put my Hand and affixed my Seal this 4<sup>th</sup> day  
 of June in the year 1705

 that they did see the Testator herein named sign & seal this Will & heard him publish  
 pronounce & declare the same to be his last Will & Testament, and that he was at the  
 same time of sound disposing mind memory & understanding, and that they  
 respectively subscribed their names to this Will in the presence & at the request  
 of the Testator and in the presence of each other
