

In the name of God Amen I Margeret Findley being weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & constitute this my last Will & Testament in the manner & form following to wit first I give and bequeath to my son William Munk one Shilling Sterling to be paid him if demanded by my Executor hereafter named - Secondly I give and bequeath to my grand son James McKinney one Shilling Sterling to be paid him if demanded by my Executor hereafter named. . . and thirdly I give and bequeath unto my grand son William McKinney all my goods and Chattels remaining after paying the above legacies and my just debts and burial. And I do constitute & appoint my above named grand son William McKinney my whole and Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 28 day of January 1702. —
