 Testament in such manner as she may think proper, and in case she
 marries againe she is to deliver up as aforesaid ^{which} To, I shall only add
 that in case my Executrix and Executors sell the Negroes they may
 vendue them in their choise of Masters, or be particular carefull in
 getting good places for them even at a rate of twenty ff Cent, And I do now
 nominate and appoint my loving wife Mary Field Executrix and my
 worthy Brother in Law Thomas Gardly and Minajah How Esq Executors
 to see this my Last Will and Testament performed hereby revoking all
 other wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
 Seal this day and year aforesaid Written September 1. 1778

 nineteenth lines on the first side of this my Will, as they contained
 nothing to my mind — Robert Field. —

William Wood and William Newbold two of the witnesses to the within Will being
 two of the people called Quakers on their solemn Affirmation do severally declare
 and say that they were present and saw Robert Field the Testator in the within
 Will named sign and seal the same, and heard him publicly pronounce &
 declare the within writing to be his Last Will and Testament, and that
 at the doing thereof the Testator was of sound and disposing mind &
 memory as far as they know and as they very believe, and that Hannah
 Wood the other subscribing witness was present at the same time and
 signed her name as witness together with the Affirmants in the presence
 of each other and in the presence of the Testator, William Wood William
