


Col. Edward Lloyd dec<sup>d</sup>, I refer <sup>164</sup> my Executors to my

eleven preceding pages, and my hand and Seal to this twelfth page  
this 29<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven-  
hundred and eighty Five.
