

As a Codicil to this my <sup>last</sup> Will and Testament my Will and desire is that all the Negroes Stock of Horses Cattle Sheep Dogs Plate and Household Furniture that I got by the death of Mr. Hopper shall descend after my death to my Wife Mary Nicholson and the Negroes and their Increase I got with her at my Marriage, as also a Negro Girl named Mary that was given to my Daughter Mary by her Grand Father Mr. Hopper and her Increase, and the Plate that was Marked with my Daughter Marys name, as also one Hundred and Twenty bus.
