


In the Name of God Amen - I Henry Wyatt of Kent-

 Wyatt the Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, In  
 Testimony whereof I've hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal  
 this Thirteenth Day of January In the Year of Our Lord One thousand  
 Seven Hundred and Eighty Seven

 the three Subscribing Witnesses to the within last Will and Testament of  
 Henry Wyatt late of Kent County deced and severally made Oath on the Holy  
 Evangelists of Almighty God, that they did see the Testator therein Named  
 Sign and Seal this Will, and that they heard him Publish Pronounce and  
 declare the same to be his last Will and Testament, that at the time of  
 his so doing he was to the best of their Apprehensions of Sound and  
 disposing mind Memory and Understanding and that they Sub-  
 scribed their Names as Witnesses to this Will in the Presence  
 and at the Request of the Testator and in the Presence of each other -  
 Before Mr. Nicholson Reg<sup>le</sup>
