

March 2. 1782 Then came Alexander Gleen one of the Subscribing Witnesses to the within last Will and Testament of Richard Hojier late of Kent County deceased, and made Oath on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God, that he did see the Testator therein named Sign and Seal this Will, and that he heard him publish, pronounce & declare the same to be his last Will and Testament, that at the time of his so doing he was to the best of his apprehensions, of sound and disposing mind, memory, and understanding, and that he this deponent together with Marmaduke Tilden & Cha. Tilden J. the other two Subscribing Witnesses within named subscribed their names as Witnesses to this Will in the presence and at the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other — at the same time came Samuel Tofsherp and Daniel Beck and severally made Oath as afo that they did see the Testator Richard Hojier sign and Seal the within Codicil — and that they heard him publish, pronounce and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament, and that he was to the best of their apprehensions of sound disposing mind, memory and understanding, and that they these deponents together with Cha. Grooms the other Subscribing Witness ~~to the~~ within ~~Codicil~~ named subscribed their names as Witnesses to the within Codicil in the presence and at the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other.
