 Estate and no more also I Give and bequeath unto Annaminta Beck Wife
 of Edward Beck the sum of fifteen pounds specie and no more, also I Give and
 bequeath unto Margrett Howard Wife of James Howard ten pounds specie
 out of my personal Estate and no more also I Give and Bequeath unto my beloved
 daughter Sarah Beck wife of Aquilla Beck the sum of twenty shillings specie
 and no more also my Will and desire is that my four Children Namely
 Rebecca, Jonathan, Edey, and Mather, shall each of them have a Good
 Feather Bed and furniture paid to them in kind out of my said Estate
 by my Executor when each or other of them shall arrive of Age namely
 the Boys at twenty one years of Age, and the Girls at sixteen years of age
